Our Sale West workers and volunteers have been busy since lockdown began, making sure that residents are safe and fully supported. Working with partner agencies we have:

- ◆ Distributed 100's of activity packs locally to children and the elderly
- Organised prescription pick-ups and food shopping
- ♦ Delivered 100's of food parcels
- Organised dog walking for 'shielding' residents
- Arranged for wellbeing calls to isolated residents
- Organised activities and food provision for the holidays
- Co-ordinated all the local volunteer support
- ♦ Manned the Community Response helpline Mon Friday

Current rules mean that our summer activities, including Munch Club, can't go ahead in their usual format. However, **Our Sale West** have ensured that 90 local children have already received activity packs and food vouchers for two take-away meals a week from the Sunshine Café. **Sale Sharks** will be running bookable slots for children aged 7—11 years old on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10.00 - 13.00hrs. **SportWorks/Gorse Hill Studios** will be offering Youth Club activities on Fridays, 6.00—8.00 p.m. depending on demand. **Communities United** have provided £15 of Tesco groceries-only vouchers every week of the holidays to selected families from three local schools and are posting weekly cooking and physical activity challenges.



# The Bread and Butter Thing

There is now a new local service available to all, called 'The Bread and Butter Thing'. Set up

> to reduce both food waste and food bills, anyone can sign up. Per week, it costs £4 (individual), £7.50 (family) or £15 (large family). To register, simply text your full name, postcode and name of your nearest hub (Sale West) to **07984 356407**.

Once registered, you simply text 'YES' by 10.00 a.m. on a Sunday and collect your food from the Sale West Community Centre at 1.30 p.m. on Monday. A typical £7.50 order is three bags: one for the fridge, one of fruit and veg and one of cupboard goods. The contents will depend upon what is available at the time.

Your first order is free of charge and there is no long term commitment. Around 45 local families have joined since June and the number is growing, so why not give it a go?
