The Bread and Butter Thing (TBBT)

What is it? It's a local service to reduce food bills and food waste. What do you get? A weekly supply of fresh, frozen and cupboard goods, all bagged up ready for you to collect. Contents vary weekly.

How much does it cost? £4 (individual); £7.50 (family); £15 (large family) per

week. First order is free! No commitment.


Where does the food come from? It's all surplus food from supermarkets, factories and farmers but it's always quality, fresh produce.

When and where does it happen? Every Monday at 1.30 p.m. outside Sale West Community Centre, Newbury Avenue, Sale M33 4QW

How do I sign up?

- 1. Text 07984 356407 with your full name, postcode and the hub you will be collecting from - Sale West
- 2. Select the size of order you want Family/Individual/ Large Family (see above).
- 3. You will receive a text every Saturday to ask if you want an order. Reply YES by 10.00 a.m. on Sunday to ensure your order will be ready for you to pick up on Monday at 1.30 p.m.
- 4. Collect and pay for your goods by card or cash from Sale West Community
- 5. If you qualify for them, Healthy Start Vouchers are also accepted as payment.

Sale West Heritage Project

The Sale West Heritage Project has been set up to capture the photos, stories and memories of community life on the Sale West estate over the last 50 years.



Our Sale West has secured Heritage Lottery funding which will literally put Sale

West on the map! The Sale West Heritage Project will offer a series of events and activities for all ages. Here are the details:

- ◆ An **Exhibition** of photos and stories of community life on the estate over the last 50 years, to be staged at the Sale West Youth Centre on **Saturday, 17th September from 10.00 14.00.**
- A walking trail and quiz entitled 'From Pigsty to Muay Thai' will be available from September 9 17th. Walk the trail to discover the history of the estate and answer the questions to be in with a chance to win some top prizes. Learn how world champions, global links and a large mansion have all played their part in its story to date.
- Free photography sessions for residents, with the 12 best photos selected to produce a 2023 calendar. These will be sold to raise funds to support our most vulnerable residents over Christmas.
- Opportunities for children and older residents to share their experience of living on the estate.

To make this project really fantastic, we need you to contribute! What does 'community' mean to you - is it the people, the place or a mindset? Do you have any photos of your time on the estate? What are your memories of living on the estate, good, bad or ugly? Are you proud of the estate and the community who live here? We can record your stories

Our Sale West 2022 Schools Climate Crisis Conference

On June 30th we welcomed pupils and staff from All Saints Primary, Ashton-on-Mersey High School, Firs Primary, St Margaret Ward Primary, Woodheys Primary and Tyntesfield Primary to the Our Sale West 2022 Schools Climate Crisis Conference.



The day began with a banner parade to the Youth Centre which was greeted by the Mayor and Mayoress of Trafford.

Following excellent presentations by all the pupil groups, we had two rounds of workshops either side of lunch. These were on

a variety of topics, including air pollution, recycling, student voice, sustainable building and food waste. We even had time for a forest bathing session outdoors in the park!



We were delighted to welcome representatives from many relevant organisations, including Trafford Council, 'Sow the City', 'Living Streets', Centre for Sustainable Energy, Gorse Hill Studios, Breath Champs, AEW Architects, Recycle4GreaterManchester and the Royce Institute (University of Manchester) who brought information and ran workshops for us.

To round off the day, each school decided on a project which they will start or continue over the next school year. They will receive support from both Our Sale West and many of the organisations who attended the conference. The six projects are:



'The Retreat Garden'; 'Sustainable Food Garden'; 'Become a WOW school' (encourage more pupils to walk to school); 'Pollution Solution'; 'Save Carrington Moss'; and 'Rewilding the Landscape'.

Finally, we all made pledges as to how each one of us would do something to help the planet. These were all displayed on a 'tree' as a visual reminder, not only of a useful and enjoyable day, but as a promise for the future. We will be supporting each school over the next year, so watch this space for an update on progress!

This summer, Our Sale West have organised 100 free meals a day, amounting to **2000**

meals in total over the holidays. 60 of these were for the Holiday Activities, funded by Trafford Council. The rest were funded by Trafford Housing Trust.

We are also providing 60 morning snacks (1200 in total) to the holiday club which is funded by Trafford Holiday Activity Fund (a Government initiative). Special thanks to Pip on the Our Sale West team who has worked so hard to coordinate all the funding!

Thanks too, to Sharks Community Trust and all the other providers of sport and craft activities for our younger residents over the holidays - lots of fun has been had by all!

Our Sale West Annual General Meeting

We held our first AGM since Covid on July 16th. It was amazing to hear about all the progress we have made!

For example, our food programmes so far have provided the equivalent of **70,000** *meals* to local residents; the Infant and Junior play areas have been revamped; new courses and classes have been introduced; our community grants have helped many local businesses and organisations and we have run subsidised coach and theatre trips.

There is so much to be proud of! We have also managed to increase the original £1m award by bringing in £542,000 of additional funding and will spend every last penny on what you, the residents want. Keep those ideas coming!
